

Victim Lawyers

Tomorrow's Lawvers: NCVLI's **Crime Victim Litigation Clinic** law students dedicated 100s of hours to victims' rights.

New Lawyers: NCVLI assisted new victims' rights legal fellows in 16 jurisdictions by responding to 59 legal technical assistance requests.

Experienced Lawyers: NCVLI's membership alliance (NAVRA) has 977 members in 49 states and the District of Columbia.



With education and training, NCVLI grew the legal advocacy community to ensure more victims have access to justice.

Meaningful Rights

Amicus Curiae: NCVLI filed 11 briefs in state and federal courts to secure victims' rights.

Legal Technical Assistance: NCVLI provided research, writing and strategic advice in response to more than 200 requests in 46 jurisdictions.

NCVLI litigated and provided expert case consultation to secure positive precedent.


Training & Support
