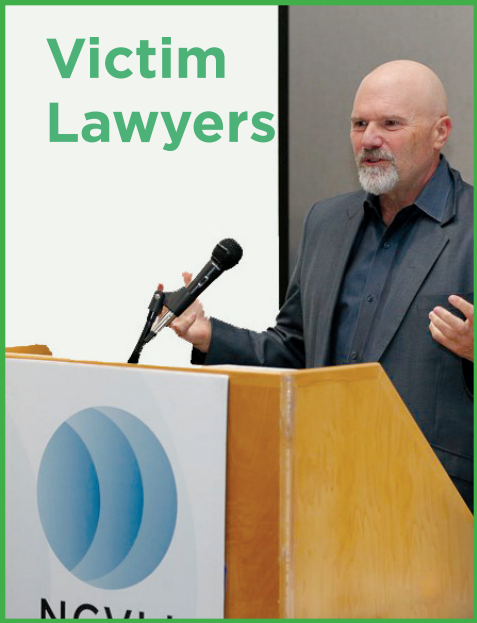


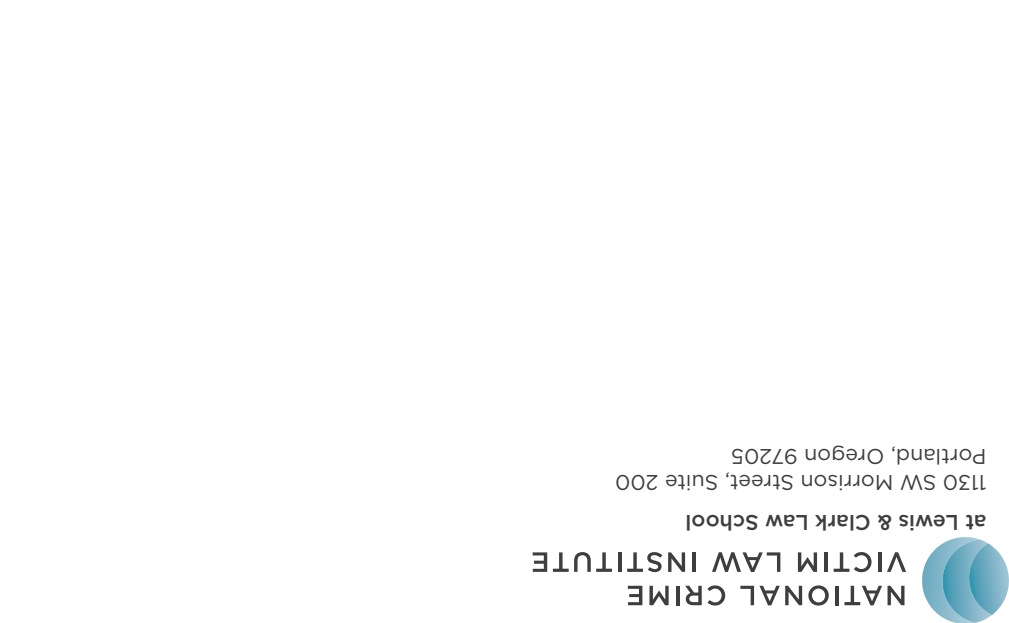

Tomorrow's Lawyers: NCVLI's Crime Victim Litigation Clinic law students dedicated 100s of hours to victims' rights.

New Lawyers: NCVLI assisted new victims' rights legal fellows in 16 jurisdictions by responding to 59 legal technical assistance requests.

Experienced Lawyers: NCVLI's membership alliance (NAVRA) has 977 members in 49 states and the District of Columbia.

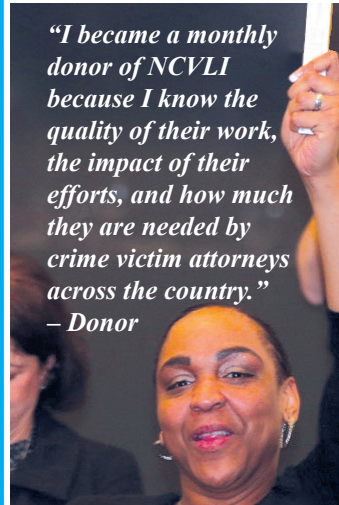
