A Glance at Our Assistance & Its Impact

California: NCVLI worked side-by-side with a California attorney, providing strategic advice and sample pleadings to successfully secure protections for a victim of domestic violence who was being subjected to abusive discovery practices. The victim's counsel said: *"Thank you ... so very much for the ongoing support and materials. They were invaluable in drafting our filings and in feeling supported going up against an opposing party with significant funds[.]"*

Pennsylvania: Defendant pled guilty to felony drug charges; in the plea agreement, he took responsibility for the victim's death. NCVLI helped put forward a restitution request for the deceased victim's future lost earnings, as well as the funeral and related expenses incurred by the family members. The requester said: *"Thank you! This is incredibly helpful, for both this case and future cases."*
