

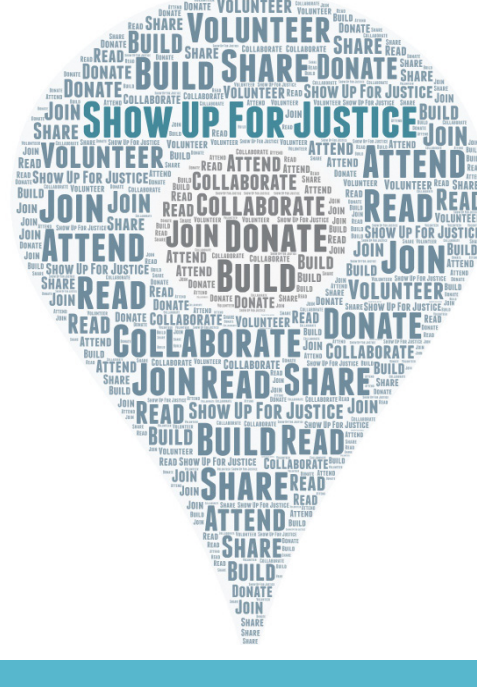

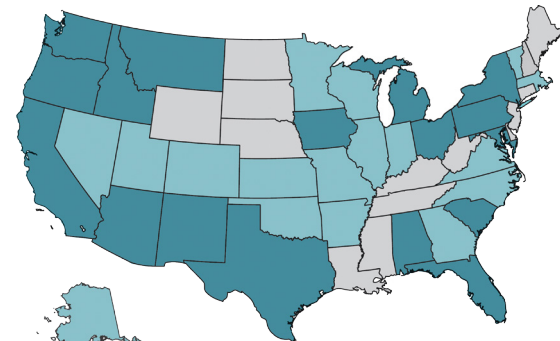
Everyone knows and respects the rights of victims • Every victim has access to a knowledgeable attorney

Showing Up Across the United States

NCVLI worked in **all 50 states** and the District of Columbia this year through training, technical assistance and partnerships. From rural locations to major metropolitan areas; from trial to appellate courts; from civilian to military justice systems, we worked to fill gaps so that victims can thrive. As the only national organization focused on rights enforcement, NCVLI has been showing up for justice across the country since 2000.

Showing Up

First responders are critical to a victim's experience and whether or to what degree they experience re-victimization. NCVLI worked with law enforcement to enhance their understanding and provision of rights in a trauma-informed way.

We conducted 8 law enforcement-specific trainings and drafted victims' rights profiles, practice tips and checklists of promising practices for **victim-inclusive, trauma-informed policing**.
